KAREN ZACARIAS (Playwright) was recently hailed by American Theater Magazine as one of the ten most-produced playwrights in the US. Her award-winning plays include The Copper Children, Destiny of Desire, Native Gardens, The Book Club Play, Legacy of Light, Mariela in the Desert, The Sins of Sor Juana and the adaptations of Just Like Us, Into the Beautiful North and How the Garcia Girls Lost Their Accent. She is the author of ten renowned TYA musicals (including Ella Enchanted: The Musical) and the librettist of several ballets. She is one of the inaugural resident playwrights at Arena Stage, a core founder of the Latinx Theatre Commons - a large national organization of artists seeking to update the American narrative with the stories of Latinos - and she is the founder of the award-winning Young Playwrights' Theater (YPT). YPT was cited by the Obama administration as one of the best arts-education programs in the nation. Karen was voted 2018 Washingtonian of the Year by Washingtonian Magazine for her advocacy work involving the arts. She is an inaugural 2019 Sine Fellow for Policy Innovation at American University and is selected by The League of Professional Theatre Women to receive the 2019 Lee Revnolds Award, given annually to a woman in theater who has helped illuminate the possibilities for social, cultural or political change. In 2021, Karen was awarded a United States Artists Fellowship award. Karen lives in Washington. D.C. with her husband and three children.

STEVE FLETCHER (Co-Director) has directed over 50 shows with CCT and acted in four. Other acting credits include nine years as the notorious Brad Vernon on ABC's daytime drama "One Life To Live". Steve can also be seen in the films Dorian Blues and The Skeptic. Regional Theatre credits include *Kingdom Of The Shore, Cat On A Hot Tin Roof, Biloxi Blues, The Threepenny Opera* and *One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest*. He earned a BFA and MFA from the Goodman School of Drama in Chicago and was a founding member of the Wisdom Bridge Theater Company and Free Street Theater Company.

CAROL MAX (Co-Director) is the founder and Producing Artistic Director of Curtain Call Theatre. She first studied acting at Kingswood-Oxford School with Viola Spolin, author of the celebrated "Improvisation of the Theatre." On the West Coast, she studied at USC and taught improvisational theatre to both children and adults. She has appeared in several CCT productions, including *Rose & Walsh*, *Old Love New Love, The Normal Heart, The Lyons, Next Fall, Rabbit Hole,* and *Love Letters* with Steve Fletcher. Directing credits include *Bakersfield Mist, Love Letters, Say Goodnight Gracie, Every Brilliant Thing, The Absolute Brightness of Leonard Pelky, The Legend of Georgia McBride (2017 & 2019), Buyer & Cellar, The Normal Heart, The Night Alive, Time Stands Still, Tigers Be Still, The Outgoing Tide, Love, Loss and What I Wore (2014 & 2016), The Whipping Man, and The Boys Next Door. She is currently busy getting ready for a thrilling and exciting new season in 2024-2025!*

BARBARA RICHARDS (Virginia) has appeared at CCT in over 25 productions, including the first production in the old theater, *Three Tall Women*. Other favorite shows are *Looking for Normal*, *Don't Dress for Dinner, Moon Over Buffalo, Love, Loss and What I Wore, Da and The Memory of Water.* Barbara has also directed at CCT: *The Whipping Man, Opus, Figaro, Don't Dress for Dinner* and *Rose and Walsh.* She has a B.A. in Theatre from the University at Albany, studied acting at HB Studios in N.Y. and performed Off-Off Broadway and in summer stock. She had a career in arts administration in both theatre and the visual arts, and retired as Director of the NYS Empire State Plaza Art Collection.

DANNY PEREZ (Pablo) is an actor, writer, and director originally from New York City, currently residing in the Capital Region. Credits include *Three Sisters* (Rode), *Proof* (Hal), *Othello* (Roderigo), *Boy Gets Girl* (Tony), *The Pillowman* (Michal), *Cry It Out* (Mitchell), *The Motherfucker With The Hat* (Cousin Julio) and most recently *The Humans* (Richard). You might recognize Daniel from his stint on an episode of HBO's CRASHING, and if you don't...it's because you blinked.

ANGELIQUE POWELL (Tania) is excited to be back on the CCT stage! Favorite past performances include *Where There's Smoke: Ilium Burns, A Deed Without a Name,* and *Models of Perfection* with Troy Foundry Theatre. She has also appeared in shows like *The Mountaintop* (BTTUNY), *Turn of the Screw* (CL), and *School for Lies* (SCP). Powell is dedicated to portraying underrepresented voices and taking risks with purpose, on and off stage.

PHIL RICE (Frank) was last seen on stage at CCT in Grand Horizons. Other favorite roles at CCT include the one-man show Say Goodnight Gracie, Death of a Salesman, and A Few Good Men. As a Director, Phil recently helmed CCT's End of the Rainbow and will be directing Becoming Dr. Ruth this summer. Phil has also appeared at The Theater Barn, Depot Theatre, and The Dorset Theatre Festival, among many other venues. Her work has been seen at many theatres in Philadelphia, and at The Public Theatre/Culture Project, Juilliard Opera Theatre, Chautauqua Theater Company, Berkshire Theatre Group, WAM Theatre, The Glimmerglass Festival, and NYU Grad Acting. FRANK OLIVA (Scenic Design) is a Cuban-American Stage Designer. Recent work includes world premieres and new productions at the Cincinnati Symphony, Two River Theatre Company, Urban Stages and the Kitchen Theatre, among others. Frank has Associate Designed projects for Broadway, Off-Broadway and International productions, including *West Side Story, Hangmen, Oklahoma*! and *Noura*. Forthcoming works include projects at Weston Theatre Company, Manhattan School of Music, Area Stage Company and Theatreworks Colorado. Frank is a graduate of NYU's Tisch School, member of United Scenic.

JOHN QUINAN (Stage Manager) has previously stage managed Betrayal, Greater Tuna, The Dining Room, Sherlock Solo, Perfect Wedding, Driving Miss Daisy, Chemical Imbalance, California Suite, Bill W. and Dr. Bob, Lend Me A Tenor, Our Son's Wedding, One Slight Hitch, The Price, Family Furniture, Hollywood Confidential, Charley's Aunt, Fit to Kill, The Absolute Brightness of Leonard Pelkey, Switzerland and Fireflies (both 2022 and 2023 Productions) at Curtain Call Theater.
